#### Computer Equipment

- All students will be provided an Apple laptop computer as a part of their educational tools, and
  this will be the only computer that will be used by the students in the classroom. At the Middle
  School, these laptops will be provided within their classes. Kiosk printers will be located around
  campus to support any printing that is needed for classwork.
- Students will receive information on their school email account, access to cloud storage for files, and access to the school information system. The school will provide access to the software needed for classwork, to include the Microsoft Office and Adobe Products.
- R-MA provides Internet access to all students via the R-MA Wi-Fi. In addition, all students will have an R-MA e-mail address for correspondence with parents, faculty, and fellow students.
- Personal computers will be permitted to connect to the R-MA Wi-Fi network, but they will not be supported by the school. Please ensure that computers have current service packs and up-to-date anti-virus software prior to arrival.
- Document the device's serial number and label the device with the student's name.
- Password protection is recommended. All devices should be in English.
- All electronics must be registered with the Academy.
